Awesome Achievements

Congratulations Cathy Richardson & SMR Fifi d'Or 2005 Tevis Cup 100 Mile Endurance Champions!

Cathy Richardson rode to victory this year in the world's toughest competition, the renowned Tevis Cup 100-mile one-day endurance ride through the Sierra Mountains. There were 199 entrants this year, and most all of the dedicated riders push their equines to the limit in hopes of claiming the Tevis Cup. Placing first is a real accomplishment, but not to take away from half of the entrants that will earn a buckle by completing the ride within the 24 hour time limit. (Which is quite an accomplishment in itself).

This incredible victory brings home to Sliger Mine Ranch the third Tevis win by home-bred and raised (and Dynamite® fed!) SMR horses. Add the winning of the Haggin Cup by Cathy in 2001 on the same horse that Potato won the Tevis Cup on in 2002, and it is pretty obvious that it is not a coincidence to see the trophies pile up at SMR.

Three weeks after winning the Tevis on Fifi d'Or, Cathy competed in the Eastern High Sierra Classic 50 miler against 85 riders and finished in third place, within seconds of the winner and was awarded the sought after - Best Condition Award. Last year, Fifi d'Or finished Tevis 9th and once again won Best Condition at the Eastern High Sierra Classic 50 miler just two weeks later.

"Jamie Michel, owner of Pet Lovers Central Doggy Daycare in Boca Raton, Chris Gaba, owner and Julian Cavazos, Manager of Central Bark Doggy Daycare in Ft. Lauderdale and Dr. Karen Kelly in Alabama are all **Dynamite**®

Distributors and are all in the throes of helping Hurricane Katrina victims.

Jamie Michel got herself a rented truck, in it she had 800 lbs. of dog food, all types of medicines donated by companies or private clients and many empty crates....she drove on up to Northwestern Florida and found herself at a shelter that was already releasing dogs from Hurricane Katrina and dropped off the supplies. She came back to South Florida with 27 dogs!! She 'defunked' them all, gave them baths and really detoxed everyone.

Jamie has a rescue at her facility called Rescue Rehab Home (www.rescuerehabhome.org). Very quickly she found homes for 20 of the dogs. Her facility became more popular than a King Tut exhibit as people tried to get in to see the dogs and to help.

Dynamite® corporate office donated **DynaPro**, **Showdown** and **Relax**. Jamie is now in LOVE with the **Relax**. Many folks that have adopted dogs ended up

purchasing the DynaPro and vitamins in her store.

"Oh honey" she responded with that southern drawl and then in the silence I surmised there was more needed than dog supplies as she and her partner have literally been feeding 4,000 people in Southern Mississippi. They need Huggies, they need tents, they need pillow cases, they need....the list goes on. She needs people to call from anywhere in the country to get at the very least 18 wheelers full of supplies at a wholesale cost or at best, donated. Her e-mail is lafter@gulftel.com. If you feel like you need to help and haven't been able to go there and

pitch in or can't afford to pitch in, here is an opportunity to

give. Her phone number is 251-943-8883.

She let me know that one of the rescue organizations only needs horse feed, the person to call is Kim 228-388-5229. Anything that comes in is gone in a New York minute. Dr. Karen's stories are hair raising of cars being washed miles away, bodies floating by, no water for anybody, with FEMA nowhere to be found. But to us



animal people, the dogs and cats have the most interesting story. Dr. Karen and her partner have rescued over the years 44 animals that they personally care for. All the dogs and cats threw up the night before – really hours before - Katrina hit. It let Dr. Karen and her partner know the magnitude of this storm before it happened and had this storm veered another few miles, they would have been flattened.

On June 20th my husband noticed the flies were bothering my 18 yr old QH "Moon", especially the face area which I thought strange because I keep fly masks on and had just sprayed the horses that morning. By the time I got

out to check it out I noticed blood coming from the nostrils and pouring down his face. I pulled off his mask to see his face split open about 1 inch from his eye. I couldn't help but kick in a pic of Joker, he is my little "**Dynamite**" Baby".





Liza is now a six year old English Pointer. She went off to training camp as a young dog and was run in field trial competition. Dog trials are run off horse back. At three years old the trainer called me and asked about the **Dynamite®** product **Showdown** which I had mentioned to him earlier. We wanted to breed Liza and she was not coming into heat. He put Liza on the **Showdown** in February and she came into heat and had a beautiful litter of nine puppies (that May) all the same size, all beautifully marked. The trainer now has his kennel on the **Showdown**. He does lots of breeding and he has mentioned he sees a big difference in the ease of breeding results.

won three 1st and one third. She competed this summer in the Region 14 Amateur All Age Championship. She finished in the top 10% out the 40 dogs entered according to the judge and 3/4 of the dogs he said were multi-champions. One dog that competed was the 2003 National Champion for American Field Trial Association. So we have been extremely pleased and have all our dogs on the Dynamite® Dog Food which includes the Showdown product. We have one more competition to go to next weekend. After that we will be able to tell for sure if Liza is Dog of the Year for 2005. Right now she is in the lead. Wish us luck!!!





Business Building

At a recent conference that Regan and I attended, MLM trainer and motivator Greg Dwyer presented some excellent points on conducting our businesses. He uses a baseball game analogy, and it can apply not only to business but to any endeavor in life or to any relationship, whether human or animal.

Home Plate is where you step up to bat. This represents Dreams and Desires. Are you clear on yours, and being

specific about what you want in your business and life? Key question: "What do I really want?"

First Base represents Doing and Discipline. What specifically did you DO today to move you closer to your Dreams and Desires? How many people did you talk to? How many meetings, conference calls, events, training tapes, etc? (Note: counting inventory and shuffling papers around does not count!) Key question: "What will I do today?"

Second Base represents mastery of Doubt and Disappointment. You need to think differently than the masses - 98% of people don't get past second base! Do you really believe your products and opportunity work? Can you take the rejection of people turning you down? (Hint: it is their stuff......not everyone will resonate with you or the products, don't take it personally!). Many times the people closest to you will be the ones throwing cold water on your dreams, or you will be sabotaging yourself through your hidden doubts, this can be a toughie. Besides rejection, you will face deception. People say they will come to the meeting, but they don't show up. Say they will sign up, but then don't. Let these people go, they will drag you down, don't try to rescue them. You will face apathy, where people try to hold you back to their level. You will face attrition, not all of your customers or downline will stay. That is OK, and normal.

Key question: "What am I thinking?"

Third Base represents mastery of Dialog and Diagnosing. This is about learning people skills and perfecting the art of asking and listening. Let people tell THEIR story, and figure out their personality style. Are they bottom line people, who can be short, dismissive, driven? Do they have an analytical mind and want numbers, facts, details, do they need to be right? Are they touchy-feely sorts who resonate more with the emotion of helping people and animals? Are they motivated by fun and a sense of belonging to a group, are they chatty? Ask enough questions to determine their

motivated by fun and a sense of belonging to a group, are they chatty? Ask enough questions to determine their personality and "hot buttons" and then concentrate on giving them what they need. Diagnosing is NOT about illness and conditions, it is about "diagnosing" via their hints and communication what their personality is and what they are looking for, fyi. First understand people, THEN seek to be understood. The questions are the answers! Too often we are in a big hurry to tell our story, best to shut up and listen first. Key question: "How can I connect with this person?" Home Plate, Home Run. This is where mastery of Duplication and Deductions comes in. Leadership is the skill highlighted here. To succeed in this business, you need to Duplicate yourself, and you do that by being a Leader. You learn to Be, then Do, then Have. And the deductions and business savvy are a big part of the having. Keep great records, the government wants to know what, where, why, who, when. The only way to gauge your Intention, is by the Results you obtain. People will do what you do, not what you say to do, so be a shining example.

All of this is about creating a Diamond Mind (baseball diamond, get it?).

"You are standing on a diamond mine of potential. Change your mind".

Laminitis part 2.....

Director Justine Hand has been blessed with a book printed in England in 1929 which has a complete homeopathic protocol for laminitis! She said she has never had a horse that did not respond.....so here you go. Interestingly, nobody has ever heard of the book or the publisher, the vets who wrote it are Meisers and Nelson, even people who specialize in finding old books come up zip. Angels, methinks????

Acute — at onset of symptoms Apis 30c every 30 minutes for 6 doses followed by 1M Belladonna 30 minutes apart

for 6 doses followed by Nux Vomica 1M every 2 hours for 6 doses

Chronic - flare up

6C Hepar Sulf hourly for 4 doses followed by 30c Silacea daily for 1 week followed

by 30c Cal Fluor daily for 1 week

Seedy toe, tissue involvement Abcesses

30c Cal Fluor 1 day a week for 4 weeks

Hepar Sulf and Silacea as above for chronic flare up

Her advice is to use 15 pellets per dose for a big horse, 10 for ponies. Source of the remedies: Celletech at 800-888-4066.

A similar protocol is offered in The Treatment of Horses by Homeopathy, authored by British Veterinarian George Macleod. The book may be purchased at www.acresusa.com.

Acute onset, to allay anxiety and regulate pulse and respiration

Aconite 30c every 30 minutes for 6 doses.

Throbbing arteries, bounding pulse, pyrexia and sweating

Belladonna 1M every 30 minutes for 6 doses. Aconite and Belladonna may be given together

Systemic Congestion

Nux Vomica 1M every 2 hours for four doses

Tissue involvement in the chronic case

Cal Fluor 30c once a week for 4 weeks.

- EquioPathics LLC makes a Musculo-Skeletal remedy comprised of Rhus Tox, Dulcamara, Ruta Grav, Calendula and Arnica. Recommended dosage for a chronic horse would be 2cc three times daily until improvement is noted. Washington Homeopathics at www.homeopathyworks.com is the source.
- Consulting a homeopathic veterinarian is always a great idea, if there is not one in your area you may consult www.hvma.com as many will do phone consultations. Using kinesiology or muscle testing may help you to isolate a remedy protocol that will help your horse, too.
- Dynamite® Release sprayed on the coronet band and sole helps with energy congestion and often gives pain relief. A poultice of **Dynamite® Miracle Clay** is truly miraculous for pain especially of abcesses.
- A great Bute herbal alternative that I have successfully used for pain relief is Herbute from Angel Smile Farm, LLC, Dynamite® Distributor Maurette Hansen. It even has some Excel added for assimilation! www.angelsmilefarm.com

The laminitis/founder issue is a huge subject, and this article has barely scratched the surface. Boots, trimming techniques, exercise, footing and more all play a huge part in preventing and managing laminitis. Remember that feet are about "moving forward in life" as much as anything else. 10 Great Balancing Foods for Women

In my practice, one of the most common complaints of female patients is hormone imbalance, showing up as either PMS, painful or irregular periods, or menopausal symptoms. In addition to our great **Dynamite®** program of the basic **Dynamite®** or **Dynamite® Plus**, **TriMins Plus**, **Elixir** and **PMS** Magnesium Supplement, here are some foods that I highly recommend.

Avocado

High in folates and Potassium, monounsaturated fats, helps with hormones and fat levels in the body.

Olive oil

Reduces heart disease, reduces pain, fights cancer, need to consume 1 to 2 oz per day, extra virgin.

Red Fish such as Salmon

High in Omega 3 fatty acids, helps with pain and balancing hormones.

Pineapple

High in Bromalein, an enzyme helpful for good digestion and for alleviating pain.

Vegetable Greens

The "other" greens like collards, beet greens, turnip greens, Swiss chard. They are a great source of Magnesium and Calcium.

Papaya

High in papain, an enzyme that helps with digestion and detox of the digestive system.

Cabbage

High in Folates and beta carotene.

Beets

High in Iron, helps with anemia, and with creating more fire and energy in the body. Grate into the 7 Day Carrot Salad at 1/4 beet, the rest carrot.

Mushrooms: Shitake, Portabella

High in B vitamins, boosts the immune system. Stir fry with sesame seed oil then mix in some greens.

Raw unsalted butter

Balances hormones. Butter only has a 9 day shelf life, so freeze it and only take out what you will use in 9 days. I recommend unsalted butter so you can taste the rancidity if it goes bad, because nothing is worse for your body than rancid fats. You may add a little Dynamite NTM Salt if you wish, when you eat the butter or cook with it.




